## OCTOBER ECO-TIP: GREEN EVENTS

As we move into the holiday season, we look forward to events with family and friends. Keep these planning tips in mind to make yours a Green Event!

**1. Send an electronic invitation.** They are free, easy to use, and a good way to keep up with your guests' comments.

**2. Go for reusable.** It is easy to use "real" silverware, plates, cups, and bowls with our fully stocked Saint Paul's kitchen. Cleaning up is a breeze with the commercial dish washer, and your Creation Care team is here to help if you need a hand. If you have to use disposable dishes, choose paper, bamboo, or other natural fibers. Paper is a renewable resource and biodegrades in the landfill, and unprinted paper napkins can even be composted. If you must use plastic, scrape, rinse, and recycle it instead of throwing it away. Avoid foam all together, because it never fully degrades.

**3. Skip throw away decorations.** Dollar store decorations end up being used for a few minutes and then trashed. Instead, take a look at what you already have and you may be surprised to find you have everything you need to create a beautiful event. Use cloth or vinyl table cloths, centerpieces made from vases, cuttings of flowering shrubs, ferns, and greenery found in your yard, fruit, and seasonal decorations that you have stored away. Chalk boards are a great way to customize a message or greeting for your guests, and consumable treats like cookies, honey, or soap are nice and useful party gifts.

**4. Recycle party trays and packaging.** It is convenient to purchase party platters from the grocery store, but when the party is over, be sure to rinse the plastic lid and base and recycle them. Paper cracker boxes, plastic tubs, cans, and glass containers can all be recycled.

**5. Share the leftovers.** At the end of the party, repackage unwanted leftover food and donate it to the Kearney Center Homeless Shelter at 2650 Municipal Way off Pensacola Street.

## SOUL FOOD UPDATE

At the suggestion of a former pastor for our congregation to "do more" and specifically naming our homeless at Lake Ella, Soul Food was born. Our first distribution was December, 2013. We currently serve 30-40 people each month (the last Saturday of the month) at the lake by distributing to go type foods, jeans, t-shirts, underwear, socks, tennis shoes, small hotel sample toiletries, laundry detergent, laundry cards and other items donated by our church family. We are encouraged to continuously "think Big" for the expansion of this needed ministry. One such expansion occurred August, 2017, when the Saint Paul's foundation awarded a grant to provide a hot meal at the lake. This occurs the second Wednesday of the month. Having both of these activities under the name of Soul Food could be confusing. For budget and reporting purposes we need to separate the two activities by finding a new name for the Wednesday night dinner component. Once a name is chosen, we will share that information with you. If you donate monetarily to Soul Food prior to a new name being chosen, please designate which component you choose to support; Soul Food or Soul Food dinner. We greatly appreciate your generosity and ask that you continue to pray for this ministry. Thank you to our current volunteers for your dedication and service. The Governing Board met on Monday, September 24; here are several of the highlights of this meeting:

KEEPING THE PROMISE CAMPAIGN: Members of the Governing Board were encouraged to return pledge cards in advance of the September 30 Commitment Sunday as a way of leading the way in supporting the church financially.

STAFF PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE: Approved the pastoral compensation proposal in order to present that to the Charge Conference on October 15, 2018.

MAKING ROOM UPDATE: Construction is set to begin on October 15 - a reminder that the construction area is designated as a hard-hat area and that no one is to be in the construction area unless accompanied by the construction manager. There will be asbestos removal completed during this phase, so site management is a priority. Photos of progress made in the construction will be shared with the congregation weekly via the website and announcement slides on Sunday morning.

STRATEGIC PLAN: The Governing Board is charged as the body that maintains and develops the Strategic Plan and we are focusing our work of the final quarter of 2018 on the progress we have made on the strategic goals and evaluating what strategic priorities need to be set for next year and beyond. As part of this process the Governing Board will be soliciting input from various ministry groups.

CHARGE CONFERENCE for Saint Paul's will be held on **Monday**, **October 15** at **6:30 p.m.** in our **Sanctuary**. ALL MEMBERS of the church constitute the voting body for Charge Conference and are encouraged to be in attendance.
