George and Jean Holzapfel are the kind of people who see a need and quietly meet it.

Take, for example, the banners in the renovated chapel. The longtime members of the Burleigh Law class were surprised and delighted to arrive one Sunday and see a few banners had gone up in the blank-looking space.

"They were just beautiful. They added so much color to the room," Jean said. "I called Kandace and said we couldn't see the ones in the back. I said I like them, and I'd like to donate some more.

"They were much more inexpensive than I expected them to be," she said, adding how much the Burleigh Law class is loving their new, evolving space. "To me, they look like stained glass windows."

The Holzapfels say Saint Paul's has been good to them since they moved to Tallahassee in 1976. While their careers kept them from going on international mission trips, they realized they could help in other ways. Years ago, the pastor from our sister church in Yaguaramas, Cuba, visited Tallahassee with his wife. The Holzapfels had them as dinner guests and got to know their story — how they ate meat maybe once a week, how \$1,000 might mean a year's salary. Jean took the pastor's wife to her closet and gave her some nice clothes to wear on Sundays. Later, they helped the church purchase windows.

The Holzapfels are no longer physically able to do mission work, but they say giving helps them feel connected.

"We like to support our Saint Paul's children, too," she said. "Some can't afford money to go on the chorus trips and such. ... We are in a position when we see something like that, we do it. It makes you feel good."

It's moving for Jean to talk about how her and George's parents modeled generosity to them. And it's moving to recall moments when she knows she made a difference. Once, her hairdresser, who was raising her two grandchildren, broke a shoulder and was out of work. Jean prayed that help would come from somewhere.

"I just prayed, and something said, 'That person could be you.' A little voice came in my head and said, 'You can help.'"

And so she did.
