Jane Lo grew up Methodist and went on her share of youth mission trips. Here in Tallahassee, she had also been learning a lot about basic carpentry and home maintenance. So when Hurricane Irma hit and Saint Paul's put together a mission team to help Floridians rebuild, Jane thought she should join it.

Join it, even if she was — how shall we put this? — on the younger side. Also, female. She wondered what her experience would feel like, but looking back she could not speak more warmly about the friendships she made.

"My experience on that trip was everyone was so generous and welcome and self-deprecating in a way that only Methodists know how to be," she said. "You wouldn't think you'd have much in common, but it was a really fun trip. You got to see a lot of heart."

On that first mission trip in 2018, the FSU professor helped install flooring in a Middleburg home that had been nearly submerged by rising river water. The hurricane relief mission team would be called into action again after Hurricane Michael hit. For the April, 2019, trip, her work schedule kept her here, except for one day that she put to good use repairing a roof in Marianna. It was clear that the community had experienced extreme poverty even before the storm hit.

"Being able to bless someone in this way was really, really powerful and impactful," she said. "It's a cliche, but you go to serve and you receive so much more from the people. These people open their homes to you. Their vulnerability — it's extremely humbling."

Jane says both trips were paid for by a mix of self-funding and church funding, but mostly the latter. She encourages people to give now so that when an emergency happens later, the organization and funds are in place to start helping people as quickly as possible.

"It's important to people to give so that things like this can happen. It's a way for folks who may not be able to physically do the work or have time to actually contribute," she said.

"And prayers, definitely. We really felt people praying for us."
