When Ryan and Kristin Kline returned to Saint Paul's, the church they grew up in, they made a decision to tithe.

"I remember being a little bit like, are you sure we can do that and still put food on the table?" Kristin recalls. "And he was like, yeah, we'll make it work."

And they always have. Almost immediately, they made arrangements for 10 percent of their earnings to be automatically withdrawn from their bank account. They love the convenience and ease of that feature, although sometimes they wonder if people notice a young couple who never contributes during offering time.

"It's awkward to pass a plate and not put anything in it," Ryan said, "but, at the end of the day, what other people think doesn't matter."

Kristin is a high school teacher and Ryan does graphic design and website creation, as well as coaching the FSU co-ed cheer team. They're not "rolling in riches," but they are proud to set an example of consistent giving to their children, 6-year-old Ryan and 2-year-old Coraline.

"At the end of the day we're pretty lucky," Kristin said. "We've got a nice house, there's food to eat — and a lot of people don't. We use it as an example to the kids to say, 'lt's important to take care of others.'

"I'm not one to hand somebody money on the side of the road. Giving money to the church feels like a safer way to give back," Kristin said. "Somehow, God provides. That should be the message."
