Strategic Planning Update: BEGIN WITH THANKS

The Strategic Planning team has had its initial meeting and has set a timeline for writing strategic and focused goals for Saint Paul's UMC in the coming years. As part of our work together, we reviewed the last Strategic Plan, and in this season of giving thanks and celebrating, want to lift up these many successes:

The near completion of the Making Room project has greatly enhanced the function of our facilities. While final touches are still pending, we anticipate this to be complete by the end of the year. We currently have several groups that use our facilities on a regular basis.

Our music/worship arts program has been energized with the addition of new opportunities - Handbells, Women's Trio, and Liturgical Dancers. We also celebrate that twelve youth and several adults participated in a summer music/worship arts camp and that an active Mommy and Me Music Program is being offered.

Our Missions Lay Team is very active. We have sent out multiple missions teams (and a youth team) to assist in hurricane relief efforts, both for Hurricane Michael and Hurricane Irma. In addition, we have sponsored two bed-build days for Sleep in Heavenly Peace, and our children provided almost 40 sets of new bedding through VBS missions.

We have an extremely active Creation Care team, which has already achieved conference recognition for its efforts during the past three years. New leaders have emerged, folks have joined the church, and the community outreach has been extraordinary – all because of this team.

We, also, celebrate an emerging Prison Ministries Team that has held a number of community events.

With the addition of BREEZE management software, we now have a consistent plan for connecting visitors to the church and are streamlining our communications and data management processes. This change has been working extremely well and is already bearing fruit.

We are regularly using more social media for outreach and seeing increased traffic on our Facebook page, which includes video sermons and event pages. We report FB metrics monthly to the conference.

Our children's ministry area remains strong, and we are seeing growth in our youth ministry program as well.

We have made great strides in connecting in meaningful ways with our sister churches in Cuba and Haiti.

For all these things – and SO MUCH MORE – we give thanks to God; to individuals and leaders who have given of time and talent and treasure; to all who regularly pray for our church and its mission.
