Dear Friends,

Over the last several weeks, you may have noticed posters and stories about ministries and people in our church - folks you know and love - who have made giving back to the church a priority; a necessary part of their discipleship journey. These are folks who have grasped the understanding that we give out of what God has given us, and we will NEVER out give God. The stories are about commitment; about generosity; about participating in missions larger than ourselves; about finding community and support through the ministries of Saint Paul's UMC. I have been inspired by these stories and about the outreach that we accomplish through this church, and through the many faithful givers that we have.

We provide funeral services for those who have no church home and grief support for those who have lost dear ones. This is what ministry is all about, and NONE of this would be possible without your giving.

Behind all ministry is the necessary support that requires funding - salaries for our amazing staff; insurance costs; apportionments that support district, conference and denominational work; utilities; office supplies and printing. We work very hard to be good stewards of your financial gifts, and I am impressed with all we are able to accomplish. The truth is, however, that we are called to give not 'just enough' but to give ABUNDANTLY and GENEROUSLY to God's work through the church.

Commitment Sunday is November 17, 2019. I encourage you to be in prayer - asking how God would have you give to support the work that we are called to do.

"I didn't know anybody. I didn't know a single soul," she recalled. "But I was desperate. I was like, I need mom friends, and what's the harm in trying?"

Spoiler alert: She liked them. She really liked them. She was excited to go back to the next meeting. She was excited to go back every month. She ended up coleading the organization for a year. And she started attending Saint Paul's. Because of MOPS, her daughter was already comfortable being in the nursery space and with the nursery staff. Tanya and her husband could attend worship knowing their daughter was happy.

The growing family ended up joining the church. "It's a church that really cares about other people," she said.
