Sermon Key Points:

- How will we make room in our lives for new places and new people?
 How do we make room in our faith community for new places and new people?
- Who are we befriending? How are we becoming aware of needs? For whom are we praying? What action are we willing to take?
- The four friends in the scripture put their faith into action so they could get their friend to Jesus.
- It was the faith of the four friends that initiated lesus' healing.
- The man is forgiven of his sins and healed. In this action Jesus demonstrates power over our deepest needs. Even deeper than the man's need to walk was his need to be made whole with God.
- · How is our faith in what God can do compelling and fueling our actions?
- The friends didn't allow physical barriers to prevent access. How are we creating access for people to meet Christ?
- Who can you identify who needs your help in overcoming an obstacle or barrier?

Small Group Discussion Starters (Or Sunday Lunch Questions)

- When have you encountered a barrier to faith? What form did it take?
- When have you seen someone go the extra mile to share Christ with someone?
- Have you ever had a friend who shared with you struggles with faith or belief? How did you respond?
- Who opened a hole in the roof to bring you closer to Jesus?

Questions for Church Leadership/Ministry Team Discussions

- What are literal physical barriers in our environment that might prevent people from encountering worship, ministries or other opportunities?
- How do you think the owner of the home felt when his roof was removed to allow the man to be lowered? Are there times we should be sacrificing concern for structure in order to fully share God with the world?
- In what ways do we encourage official and unofficial leaders in our communities to look to new and unexpected strategies to share faith and service?
- Which of our ministries best facilitates friendships that would lead to the type of service offered in this passage?
