SAINT PAUL'S STEPS UP AGAIN

The Cheers Sunday School Class Project to collect used bicycles has been completed and the results are in. Thanks to the Saint Paul's congregation's generous contributions of bicycles, time and money, many needy folks in our community will benefit. Cheers teamed up with Bicycle House, a Tallahassee non-profit, to provide refurbished bikes to people who need them. In all, 37 bikes were donated to Bicycle House, along with \$2,268 in cash (including \$500 from the Cheers Class). The cash can be used to purchase things like tires, tubes, seats and locks that will help make the bikes as good as new. In addition, 4 individuals from Saint Paul's are donating their time to work with other volunteers at Bicycle House to make those old bikes bright and shiny. And, Saint Paul's Youth have used Bicycle House as a field trip to learn more about the value of this service to the community.

During its 12 years of operations in Tallahassee, Bicycle House has given away thousands of bikes to people who need them and have never charged a penny to a recipient. So, the Cheers Sunday School Class says ... Thanks Saint Paul's!



SABBATH MONTH

As part of our faith, we practice a weekly rhythm of work and rest. Sabbath time is important for us to be healthy, to make sure we are not consumed with work, and to take time to appreciate life. In the Old Testament, when this practice is introduced, it is important that not just the faithful rest, but that they also give others the opportunity to rest – their employees, their animals, and even the land. Rest is necessary.

HURRICANE RESPONSE THROUGH OUR CHURCH

Dear Saint Paul's Church,

Thank you for your wonderful response to the hurricanes over the past years! Our church sent hurricane recovery mission teams to the areas hit hardest by Hurricanes Katrina, Hermine, Irma, and Michael (three Saturdays removing debris from yards near Marianna, two rebuilding work weeks near Greenville and Port St. Joe). Then we were prevented from working in close proximity with others by the COVID pandemic. We were still able to hire professionals to repair the homes of several people in Port St. Joe and Havana. We are now into the hurricane season again and need to build a team of volunteers to prepare for helping after the next storm.

We need many kinds of help (skilled and unskilled labor, painters, cleaners, comforters, etc.) so if you are interested in helping us form a team of volunteers, Will you please email Don Griesheimer, <u>dgriesheimer@comcast.net</u>?

FROM OUR SISTER CHURCH IN SOISSON HAITI

Good evening to our brothers and sisters in Florida. I greet you in the name of Jesus our savior. We are glad that we answered our email despite the delay it took, we are pleased, we continue to ask for prayers for the different needs that we mentioned in the last emails and we ask for prayers for a steward in the congregation whose father died for this family, the Michel family, we take the opportunity to thank you for your prayers because the situation of insecurity that was developing in the area is beginning to improve and the faithful regain their perseverance, we bless the name of God, may God bless. A BRIEF HISTORY OF OUR RECOVERY MISSIONS FROM CHARLIE GUYTON

In addition to Hurricane relief, we had an earthquake relief trip to Haiti (co-led by John Apthorp and me) and several follow up trips to our sister church led by Flo or Lee Anne.

Hurricane Katrina: We sent multiple teams over four to five years (in some years we sent more than one team) to Louisiana and Mississippi in response to Hurricane Katrina. Bob Raynor led most of those trips.

Tuscaloosa Tornado: We sent at least one team in response to the devastating tornado in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. Bob Raynor led that team.

North Florida Flooding: We sent one team to Lake City to address flood damage, which I recall was related to rains from a tropical storm. Bob led that team as well.

Hurricane Ivan: We sent one week long team to Pensacola to repair homes damaged by Hurricane Ivan. I led that team.

Hurricane Irma: We sent two teams to the Jacksonville area to address flooding associated with Hurricane Irma, which hit South Florida and moved up the Peninsula. It was a tropical storm when it reached North Florida, but it caused the St John's River to back up, causing catastrophic flooding. I led those two teams.

Hurricane Michael: We sent ten teams over two to three years to the Florida Panhandle in response to Hurricane Michael. An initial consultation trip was made to Mariana. At least three day trips were made to Mariana to clean up storm debris. Two week long trips were made to Mariana to repair multiple homes there and in the surrounding area. Two week long trips to Port St. Joe were made to repair homes. Another two trips were made to Carrabelle to repair a storm-damaged house. I or Don Griesheimer organized or lead most of those trips.

We look forward to seeing you when you are up here.
