Here is a sample from this book:

We are not saved by any formulas or theologies or any priesthood extraneous to the human journey itself."

We are so excited to share that the peanut farmers in Southwest Georgia donated over 3,200 **jars of peanut butter** to Manna on Meridian last month. This is an AMAZING donation as it will cover our peanut butter needs for about 10 months! This donation is valued somewhere between \$5,000-6,000. We received our first Second Harvest (SH) order on September 14. As with anything new, we learned some things and hope to make the experience easier next time for all involved. We were able to purchase over 1,800 pounds of food for about \$700. We will implement the tracking system needed for Second Harvest next month- no names, just demographic information.
