Attach any graphics or images that you wish to include. Announcement slides for worship and Wednesday night are 16:9 presentation slides. We are happy to print flyers that you have designed for the bulletin boards. In general, we will only advertise events that are part of the ministry and mission of Saint Paul's UMC.

To use any of the rooms or spaces around the church, contact Linda Fletcher in the church office. Rooms are free to use for church activities and ministry events, but the rooms still must be reserved ahead of time. There is a room use form that must be filled out whenever space is requested. For non-church activities, there is a room-use fee, with a reduced rate for members. Room uses that are not related to church ministry activities must be approved by the Trustees.

MANNA ON MERIDIAN

Manna recipients have grown this year and we are serving 300 families per month which translates to 700-1000 people. Pairing with Second Harvest has helped us tremendously and they give us large amounts of fresh produce in addition to canned goods, pasta and rice. We have added bread and baked goods donated by Publix, which are distributed on Sunday mornings. However, while we have made significant strides in bringing down our expenses in 2023 and will continue to do so, we spent \$20,000 more than we received in donations from our congregations this year. Thank you for all your contributions and help and please consider Manna on your list of projects to whom you donate.



THE CUBA CROSS


