CHEERS GUEST SPEAKER ON APRIL 7

The CHEERS Sunday School Class and Pastor Latricia invite you to join them in a lesson/discussion of human rights led by Mark Schlakman on April 7 during the Sunday School hour in Sander's Hall. Mr. Schlakman met Pastor Latricia when she moderated the God Squad recently. She recommended Mr. Schlakman to CHEERS because of a January class she facilitated for us on the Hamas/Israel/Gaza and larger Palestinian struggle. After discussing the upcoming class with the pastor, we feel that many in the church would benefit from hearing his message.

Mr. Schlakman is a lawyer with a background that includes serving as special counsel to Florida Governor Lawton Chiles, as a senior advisor on The White House staff during the latter stages of Clinton administration, a foreign affairs officer at the outset of the George W. Bush administration and as a special assistant to a four-star Marine Corps general before the general was appointed as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Mr. Schlakman current serves as senior program director of the Florida State University Center for the Advancement of Human Rights. He teaches a range of interdisciplinary human rights and national security courses that are cross-listed for grad, honors and undergrad students that are offered jointly through multiple colleges on main campus at FSU, and he has taught Immigration and Refugee Law and Policy at the College of Law.



EARTH DAY IS APRIL 22nd

The first Earth Day in 1970 mobilized millions of Americans and birthed the modern environmental movement. Since then, Earth Day has evolved into the largest civic event on Earth, energizing billions across 192 countries to take action to safeguard our planet. It means even more to United Methodists as our book of discipline reminds us of our call to care for God's Earth. The Creation Care team started celebrating Earth Day early this year by doing a cleanup at Lake Ella on March 2 on our adopted street -- Lake Ella Drive. Friends, neighbors and city officials joined us to pick up litter along the .6 miles around the lake.

The theme of Earth Day this year is Plastic vs. Planet. We now know how harmful plastic is to life on our planet. It is estimated that up to 199 million tons of plastic are currently in our oceans with 14 million tons added yearly.

The Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church encourages the local church to pursue becoming Plastic & Foam Free by making simple swaps from single use plastic and foam to reusable dishes or those that are made from paper and biodegradable materials like bamboo. Avoid plastic whenever possible and chose aluminum cans over plastic because they are easier to recycle.

Take a look around your own house....almost everything we buy comes in a plastic container or wrapped in plastic! It's a challenge to change our ways, but alternatives are readily available for items we use every day, like dissolvable laundry detergent sheets, re-use zip-lock bags and other resealable containers, metal straws, even a "shampoo bar" instead of bottled shampoo.

CAPITAL AREA JUSTICE MINISTRY

Will you show your love of justice by attending the Capital Area Justice Ministry's NEHEMIAH ACTION? Our church is praying to have at least 100 of our church gather with other people from 16 other houses of worship on TUESDAY, APRIL 16, 6:30-8:00. The plan is for 1000 people of the Tallahassee area to show our elected leaders our concern and plans regarding the lack of affordable housing and the plague of gun violence at the Old West Florida Enrichment Center, 2344 Lake Bradford Road. We will be taking our church bus which will leave from our parking lot at 5:30 pm. Email amy@saint paulsumc.org to reserve a bus spot. Child care will be offered (10 and under, reservations required) by Beth Wilde in our children's building.

YOUR presence will add power to our requests of our leaders. For example, on February 29, Over 80 CAJM members turned out to press the Blueprint Intergovernmental Agency to continue the process of adding affordable housing to the Blueprint project list. We won by a vote 12-8.

They are having extremely hard times economically but the church is growing in faith, in conversions, healing, love and joy.
