HOLY WEEK AT SAINT PAUL'S

Holy Week is the culmination of the Lenten season, and leads us through some of the most intense days in the life of Jesus. The most sacred of weeks culminates with the celebration of resurrection on Easter morning. CHEERS GUEST SPEAKER ON APRIL 7

The CHEERS Sunday School Class and Pastor Latricia invite you to join them in a lesson/discussion of human rights led by Mark Schlakman on April 7 during the Sunday School hour in Sander's Hall. Mr. Schlakman met Pastor Latricia when she moderated the God Squad recently. She recommended Mr. Schlakman to CHEERS because of a January class she facilitated for us on the Hamas/Israel/Gaza and larger Palestinian struggle. After discussing the upcoming class with the pastor, we feel that many in the church would benefit from hearing his message.

Mr. Schlakman is a lawyer with a background that includes serving as special counsel to Florida Governor Lawton Chiles, as a senior advisor on The White House staff during the latter stages of Clinton administration, a foreign affairs officer at the outset of the George W. Bush administration and as a special assistant to a four-star Marine Corps general before the general was appointed as chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff. Mr. Schlakman current serves as senior program director of the Florida State University Center for the Advancement of Human Rights. He teaches a range of interdisciplinary human rights and national security courses that are cross-listed for grad, honors and undergrad students that are offered jointly through multiple colleges on main campus at FSU, and he has taught Immigration and Refugee Law and Policy at the College of Law.

MISSION ministries

MANNA ON MERIDIAN

For anyone not familiar with Manna on Meridian, it is a monthly food distribution program run by 4 churches on Meridian Road - Faith Presbyterian, St. Stevens Lutheran, Saint Paul's, Unitarian Universalist, and joined by Grace Lutheran.

We served 130 families in January 2020 and have tripled our numbers to 354 in January 2024.

That means we have triple the amount of groceries and produce to purchase, unload, shelve, bag and distribute each month.

We have **not** tripled the number of volunteers who perform these jobs.

Here is when we need you:

Groceries are delivered from Second Harvest on the third Wednesday each month and need to be unloaded, shelved and unwrapped between 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.

Fresh produce from local farms is delivered and bagged on the third Friday between 1:00 and 2:00 p.m.

Distribution and bagging for the next month takes place on the third Saturday each month from 7:00 a.m. set up to 10:00 a.m.

Bread and baked goods distribution 11-12:30 on Sundays. (Publix only donates items not sold on Sundays each week)

We need volunteers to commit to 2 hours a month at one of those times to support this program that helps feed hungry families on our community. If you wish to volunteer but are not available at those hours let me know and we can arrange a convenient time for you.

Please seriously consider this opportunity and let me know of your availability and any questions.

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR OF YAGUARAMAS METHODIST CHURCH,

REV. ALEXIS BETANCOURT:

"....we would like to see what possibility there may be of helping us with a budget to give food to the children of the church every Sunday, because here they do not have provision. The economic situation in Cuba is serious, we do not have electricity, we do not have food, we do not have toilets. We lack many resources for daily maintenance, children are not able to grow because of many deficiencies. ...we need you, to tell you that we can do everything through Christ who strengthens us"



Our Mission Lay Team stewards the funds our congregation donates for mission work and we decided to send \$800 for the first three months of this feeding program in our sister church in Yaguaramas, Cuba. Last week their pastor, Rev. Betancourt, texted me that they had finally received our gift. He sent me this photo two weeks ago, showing some of the children whom we will be feeding over the next three months. If all goes well we hope to renew our support every three months. Thanks to all you donate to help our friends in Christ in Cuba!

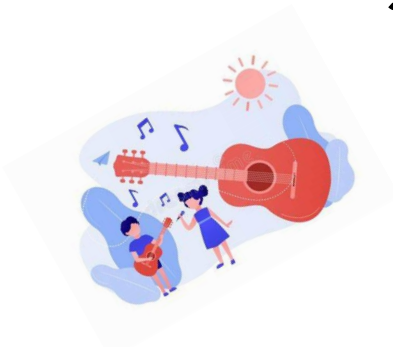
