A message from our NW District Disaster Coordinator

EPIST

"I spent several days last week in Dade City, just a few miles north of Tampa. It is a high spot in the middle of broad flatlands, an area that is home to many small rivers and streams and the people who enjoy them. Then Hurricane Helene drenched the area as it skirted the coast. And Hurricane Milton really topped things off, raising inland water levels to record heights. The flooding would last for more than days or even weeks. It has been two months (TWO MONTHS!) and many residents are just now able to see what is left of their homes - if they have a four-wheel drive truck to get there. Our Annual Conference's Disaster Response Ministry has partnered with the Red Cross to get essential supplies into the area. But there just are not enough volunteers to go around, and I was there because I was needed. No, it wasn't convenient. Yes, I had to put some other things on hold. And it was *almost* a time when I couldn't go.

But you know what? Disaster doesn't care. No disaster ever showed up "just in time." And when disasters do show up the potential volunteers in that area are suddenly overwhelmed with the struggle to be survivors. Time passes, and while these people's lives are no longer in the "news cycle" they are still in crisis. So, when I heard I went. And I wasn't alone – I made several new friends as we labored together, figuring it out, making-do with the resources we had.

This is what disaster response ministry is all about – It is facing those days when the wind, the water, and other elements of nature demand attention, when disaster doesn't care about our plans.

The Southeastern Jurisdiction Disaster Academy (Fruitland Park, January 9-12, 2025) is a place where we can strengthen our readiness. Yes, it starts in the middle of the week. Disaster doesn't care. Yes, many of us already have a major event happening that Sunday. Disaster doesn't care. Be there if you can. Bring others with you if you can. And if you cannot (and believe me, I know what that is like!) encourage others to be there! Help recruit others to join us in this ministry.

I enjoy an orderly life, and am usually a careful planner.... But disaster doesn't care. Hurricane Idalia, Wind Storm Finn, the Tallahassee Tornados, Hurricane Debby, Hurricane Helene, Hurricane Milton.... Good grief, Charlie Brown! Let's show disaster what is what!
