PROTECTING OUR FRESH WATER: A SHARED RESPONSIBILITY

Water is essential for human existence and life in general. H2O....this inorganic, transparent, tasteless, and odorless chemical that we take for granted every time we turn on the tap.... is unique to Earth. It is the only planet in our solar system known to have liquid water on its surface. Water resources are renewable in one way as water is continuously recycled on Earth, but it is NOT renewable in that we only have the same amount of water on the Earth now as we had since its formation. The **fresh** water on our planet is only 2.5% of the total amount of water, so it is crucial to manage water resources to prevent depletion or contamination. As stewards of God's creation, we are called to protect this precious gift — not just for ourselves, but for our neighbors and generations to come. Here are a few ideas for how to help preserve the quality of our fresh water lakes, rivers, streams and springs:

Local Water Justice and Advocacy Opportunities in Leon County

- --Join the Water Resources Committee to learn about water justice from board members with conservation, legal and planning backgrounds who provide input to county commissioners.
- --Partner with the Leon Soil and Water Conservation District, a group that educates and advocates for conservation practices. Monthly meetings open to the public.
- --Support the Office of Sustainability, a Leon County team that runs shoreline cleanups, community garden grants and more.
- --Explore Water Quality Data using county's interactive Water Quality Map to understand pollution trends.
- --Follow Florida Springs Advocacy at floridaspringscouncil.org
- --Volunteer for a Lake Ella Clean-up on SPUMC adopted street, Lake Ella Drive.

In reverence to this precious resource, pray this prayer every time you drink a glass of water.

Dear God, we know we are the hands and feet of Christ in this world. May we honor You with our care for creation and reflect your love in every drop of water by choosing care over convenience and advocacy over apathy. Amen

CAPITAL AREA JUSTICE MINISTRY

What an incredible day we had at the County Commissioners meeting on July 8th!

We showed up. We spoke out. We stood together. And we WON.

The commissioners voted to approve \$500,000 per year for the gap financing initiative—a huge step forward for affordable housing in our community. This didn't happen by accident. It happened because of YOU. Because people cared enough to show up, to speak up, and to stand firm for justice.

Let's be honest and proud:

We set an ambitious goal of 150+ people in that chamber. We didn't hit it this time.

But over 90 strong, determined, committed members of CAJM Nation packed the room, wearing green, standing as one voice for our neighbors.

That mattered. That made a difference. That helped win the vote.

Rev. Sylvia Jones – who called us higher with her passion and faith.

Jordan Rios – who spoke so clearly about our community's urgent needs.

Apostle Otis B. Young, our Co-President – whose leadership and conviction anchored us all.

Your words moved hearts and changed minds in that chamber.

We might not have hit 150 this time. But 90+ committed justice-seekers is nothing to dismiss. You showed up. You spoke out. You helped secure a real investment in affordable housing. And we're just getting started. Thank you for your heart. Thank you for your commitment. Thank you for believing that Tallahassee can be a city where everyone belongs. Let's keep going.
