Among the words and phrases of the past were: "unprecedented," "in these uncertain times," "in an abundance of caution," and "pivot." And then there's this one, which I probably heard more than any other one on the list:

I'll admit that phrase set off an ear worm of the song from High School Musical by the same name.

I guess people thought it was an overused phrase, except here's the problem: it's true. Socially, emotionally – and most importantly, biblically – we really are in this together.

Read how Paul describes the ideal faith community to the church in Corinth: But God has so arranged the body, giving the greater honor to the inferior member, that there may be no dissension within the body, but the members may have the same care for one another. If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it. (1 Corinthians 12:24-26) And Paul was clear with the Ephesians, that the way to be all in together was to pray for each other:

Offer prayers and petitions in the Spirit all the time. Stay alert by hanging in there and praying for all believers. (Ephesians 6:18 CEB)

SOLIDARITY PRAYER VIGILS

So if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it; if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with it. –1 Corinthians 12:26

When a piece of the Everglades became a deportation facility (aka Alligator Alcatraz) some of our neighbors who had been detained were placed in that remote place. Separated from their families, lawyers and churches, the detainees probably felt very alone, perhaps abandoned, even by God. Beginning in August hundreds of people of various faiths and those of conscience began holding prayer vigils at 5:00 pm every Sunday. Eventually the Roman Catholic diocese of south Florida received permission to hold weekly Masses inside the camp. Beginning in September and continuing today, we are having prayer vigils in solidarity and at the same time as the folks outside of the South Florida Detention Center -5:00 pm Sundays on the steps of the Historic Capitol. We have heard first hand testimonies of the suffering caused by this new model of doing deportations. Everyone is entitled to due process because every human being is made in the image of God, according to our faith. Concern for the foreigner is a common issue in other religions also-so this is an interfaith vigil. Everyone is invited to attend a vigil. Bring your own lawn chair and pray with us.
